Betty Endicott Scholarship Recipients Announced

Reston, VA, May 15, 2019 --- The National Capital Chesapeake Bay Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS-NCCB) is pleased to announce the 2019 Betty Endicott Scholarship recipients. The [Betty Endicott Scholarship](#) is given annually from the NATAS-NCCB Chapter to full-time undergraduate or graduate students studying for a career in communications and/or broadcast journalism.

This year Cindy Choi of American University and Max Marcella of the University of Maryland have each earned \$2,500 to be used towards their broadcast journalism education. Both are standouts among the almost dozen scholarship applicants. As a multimedia journalist, Ms. Choi, was part of the Florida Sun Sentinel Pulitzer Prize winning coverage of the Parkland school shootings last year. Mr. Marcella is a member of the all-volunteer production team for the Merrill Capital News Service Broadcast Bureau where he covers important stories from Capitol Hill to the State Capitol in Annapolis.

Both Ms. Choi and Mr. Marcella will be honored at the 61st Emmy Awards on June 22, 2019.

“NATAS-NCCB is proud to continue a tradition of fostering growth among young journalists,” said Chapter President Les Heintz. “And we are pleased to award this scholarship to both Ms. Choi and Mr. Marcella.

The regional scholarship, named in the honor of Betty Endicott, the first female news director in Washington D.C., is open to all full-time undergraduate and graduate students studying for a career in communications and/or broadcast journalism. Applicants represented a wide range of schools from Virginia Tech to Hampton University to Washington-Lee and University of Maryland. The local chapter covers all of Virginia, Maryland and DC, and students at any of the schools in the chapter were eligible to apply.
